



Citizen-Initiated Local Special Taxes Passed Since 2018 With Less Than Two-Thirds

28 measures approved by local voters by majority vote that would have been blocked under Prop 43's two-thirds threshold, together funding roughly **\$2.84 billion a year** in local services.
